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PACKING LIST – MOZAMBIQUE GAME SAFARI

The following list is only a general guideline of what to bring on safari. Please remember laundry is done daily - except when you are in spike, camping away from base camp, (which is seldom more than a night), so don't over pack.

- 2 x Pairs of good walking boots or running shoes (worn in)
- 1 x Pair swamp boots (Mozambique Buffalo hunts only)
- 4 x Pairs of good socks
- 1 x pair of light weight gloves
- Knee pads
- Buff or face netting
- Rifle sling for swamp hunt
- 3 x long hunting pants (Olive Drab or Dark Green)
- 3 x short hunting pants
- 3 x hunting shirts (Olive Drab or Dark Green)
- 1 x Realtree coverall with zip
- 1 x Hunting Jacket - Realtree type camo (Olive Drab or Dark Green)
- 1 x Warm sweater or jumper
- Light Weight rain gear
- Sun Screen & Chapstick or lip balm
- Cap or Hat (dark in color)
- Casual wear for evenings
- Personal Camera Equipment / Insect repellent
- Malaria prophylaxis
- "Skin So Soft" by Avon (for Tsetse fly's)
- Binoculars
- Shooting sticks (if you prefer your own)
- USB flash drive or SD card for copying your PH's pictures onto
- Lens cleaning cloth (Camera/Binocular)
- Flashlight
- Pocket knife
- Sunglasses
- Small backpack for daily equipment while hunting (e.g. cameras, extra ammo)
- Rifle with sufficient ammunition
- International plug set - conversion to South Africa 220 V
- First aid is on hand in camp and in all hunting vehicles, but it would be wise to bring your own requirements along
- Spare batteries if required
- Rifle cleaning kit, regular wipe down set.
- Prescription drugs if required.
- Toiletries & Baby/Wet wipes for the ladies on safari
- Taxidermy tags if you have your own Taxidermist (shipping Instructions) & Any CITES permits you may require
- Rifle soft case for each gun, as hard cases are too bulky for the charter & are to be left in our office in Beira. These are also good to use on the vehicles.

Please Note:

1. Military type cammo is not permitted in most African countries, but Realtree types are normally accepted.
2. Laundry is done on a daily basis, except for the days when you change camp and the day of departure.
3. Mozambique is generally warm all year, but can rain all year round.
4. Average temperatures range from 65f to 85f.
